PEOPLE Bill Morrissey is the new senior vice-president of membership and marketing for the **Winnipeg Chamber of Commerce**. Morrissey, who has held senior leadership roles with **Xerox** and **Standard Aero**, will lead a new initiative to attract more private-sector investment to Winnipeg through a collaborative economic partnership to be launched in October.

Darren Christle has assumed the international presidency of the **Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance (CVSA)**.
